The winner of the Distinguished Paper Award will earn a slot to present his or her paper on the 2014 AERA meeting program and receive \$500 toward travel to the 2014 AERA meeting. The winner of the Marvin Wyne Outstanding Student Paper Award will receive a \$100 award. Winner of both awards will be recognized in the NCARE Fall 2013 Newsletter and at the NCARE 2014 annual meeting.

The paper must have been presented at the 2013 annual meeting, but not previously presented or published elsewhere. Any person who is a member of NCARE at the time of the annual meeting may submit a paper for consideration. Students may apply for the Marvin Wyne Outstanding Student Paper Award or for the Distinguished Paper Award but not both (simultaneously). For consideration for the Marvin Wyne Outstanding Student Paper Award, a student or students must have wholly written the paper.
